

FREQUENCY ADVERBS

We use frequency adverbs to describe how often some thing happens. We use them with the Present Simple tense.



EXAMPLE:

I drink coffee every morning of the week. =

Always

I drink coffee two, three, or four mornings a week. =

Sometimes

• I drink coffee once or twice a year. =

Rarely

I <u>rarely</u> eat junk food. I'm <u>usually</u> a salad-and-fruit person. But I'll eat a piece of pizza <u>once in a while</u>.

- 1)Adverbs of frequency usually come before the verb.
- 2) However, they come after the verb be.
- 3) Some adverbs come at the end of the sentence.
- 4) Some adverbs and expression can come at the beginning of the sentence.
- 5) some adverbs can not be conjugated with NOT.



1)Adverbs of frequency usually come before the verb.

always come to class late.

usually eat breakfast at the restaurant.

<u>often</u> Studies english at the university.

sometimes Watches television in her house

rarely eats this kind of food

<u>seldom</u> play videogames in the game station.

hardly ever exercise in the gym.

<u>never</u> buy bread at the bakery.

2) However, they come after the verb be.




3) Some adverbs come at the end of the sentence.

Expression such as all the time, now and then, once in a while, twice a week, once a month, every two months usually come at the end of the sentence.

Michael stayed in Switzerland for three days.





I am going on vacation for a week.





Joshua and Ellen have been riding horses for several years.






Angely plays the piano once in a while.



And indeed Daniel does make a mistake now and then





4) Some adverbs and expression can come at the beginning of the sentence.

Sometimes Mr.Jones Works late. From time to time, he brings work to do at home.



5) some adverbs can not be conjugated with NOT.

Expression such as *rarely, seldom, hardly ever* and *never*; they already carry a negative meaning, so *not* is not used with them.

*Jack never shaves.

*Jack hardly ever shaves.

*Jack rarely shaves.

*Jack seldom shaves.

*Jack frequently doesn't shave.

*Jack occasionally doesn't shave.

*Jack sometimes doesn't shave.

* Jack usually doesn't eat breakfast.

*I don't always eat breakfast.

*Jack doesn't ever shave.

Verb to be (not)

*My roommate generally isn't home.

*My roommate sometimes isn't home.

*My roommate ins't always home.

*My roommate is hardly ever home.


